CM launches expansion of breakfast scheme

The government provided nutrient supplements to them, as a result, 60,000 children recovered from malnutrition. Mr. Stalin said the breakfast scheme was aimed at eradicating hunger by enhancing the nutritional status and reducing malnutrition among children. It would also help to ease the burden on working mothers and increase the attendance and retention of children in schools.

Quoting the verses 'Undi koduthu uyir koduthu' (those who give nourishment to living beings in this world give precious life itself) from Manu Smriti, one of the five Tamil epics, he said, "Through the government has been implementing many flagship schemes, such as free bus travel for women and Panchayat Pura, the breakfast scheme is close to my heart and gives me immense satisfaction as it aimed at eradicating hunger, malnutrition, and anemia among school children."

The Chief Minister urged officials to ensure the effective implementation of the scheme and appealed to the students to study well and enhance their skills. "Those who achieve good marks in school will be rewarded with a special prize. The government will continue to execute welfare measures following the principles of social justice and following in the footsteps of the leaders of the Dravidian movement."

Dravida model giving life to kids: CM

Launches Breakfast Scheme Extension

Nagapattinam: Chief Minister M K Stalin on Friday said the breakfast scheme was aimed at eradicating hunger by enhancing the nutritional status and reducing malnutrition among children.

He was speaking after inaugurating the extension of the scheme at the government middle school at Thirukuvai, where his father M Karunanidhi studied.

Stalin later had breakfast with the students.

"Though I have implemented many schemes for the benefit of the people, this breakfast scheme gives me immense satisfaction. There is a saying that 'undi koduthu uyir koduthu' in Tamil, which means 'one who gives food is a giver of life'. So, our Dravida model government is giving life to our children," he said.

"The money spent is an investment for the better future of our children. This investment will return in the form of knowledge and skill that will build our country," Stalin said.

The chief minister launched the scheme on September 15, 2022, in Madurai. The first phase covered 1.14 lakh children in 1,545 corporation, municipal and panchayat schools. As many as 1.54 lakh students in 1,968 schools were brought under the scheme from February 28.

Taking a dig at Governor R N Ravi, the CM said, "The DMK government is running a social justice regime that gives everything to everyone. But there are a few people who put barriers to our principles in the name of NEP 2020 and NBT. In those days, the Ekklavya offered his thumb (to Draupadi), Times have changed. It is not the time of Draupadi but of Ekklavya," he stated.

In Chennai, youth welfare minister Udhayanidhi Stalin said attendance of students had increased by 30% to 40% following the scheme's launch last year.

He had food along with students at a school in Triplicane. HR & CE Minister P K Sekar Babu and health minister Ma Subramanian launched the scheme in their constituencies while in Triplicane, minister K N Nehru launched the scheme. In Madurai, commercial taxes minister P Moorthy inaugurated the scheme at Chinnaipatti panchayat union primary school.

Information technology minister Palaniivel Thiagarajan, accompanied by mayor V Indrani Parvathamma and others, had food with students at Muthupatti Government Kalar High School.
