Chief Minister M.K. Stalin on Saturday urged representatives of local bodies to take up rainwater harvesting, stating that it would replenish groundwater levels and provide long-term water security to villages.

The Chief Minister, who interacted with around 10,000 representatives of local bodies during a webinar, dedicated a major portion of his speech to clean drinking water, sanitation, and the use of plastics, waste management, disease prevention, and environmental protection.
